




## General Services Administration: Increased Direct Delivery of Supplies Could Save Millions: Ggd-93-32 (Paperback)

Pursuant to a congressional request, GAO reviewed the General Services Administration s (GSA) depotbased supply distribution system to determine if shipping directly from suppliers to customer agencies would reduce costs. GAO found that: (1) GSA could save millions of dollars if it shipped orders directly from suppliers to customer agencies; (2) federal agencies pay nearly three times as much in processing costs for orders filled at GSA depots than those filled directly from suppliers; (3) for a 1-year period ending February 1991, GSA only delivered 7 percent of its supplies directly to customer agencies, even though 83 percent of its inventory had the potential to be delivered directly to customers; (4) if GSA maximized direct delivery, it could significantly reduce depot operations and achieve a savings over time of up to \$240 million; and (5) GSA could further streamline operations by considering other supply alternatives for filling low-value, low-quantity orders.
